

## How euthanasia is impacting Canadians

There has been a steep increase in the number of people dying by medical assistance in dying (MAiD) every year. **More than 15,000 people died by MAiD in 2023.**

- Canada's MAiD laws have vague and subjective terms which are left to the
  interpretation of individual doctors, such as when a person's death is "reasonably
  foreseeable" and what kind of "serious" disability or illness makes someone eligible
  for euthanasia.
- Some people whose disability makes them eligible for MAiD are requesting MAiD because of circumstances such as a lack of housing or medical/social supports.
- A law allowing MAiD for mental illness alone has been passed and is set to take effect in March 2027.
- The federal government has been holding consultations on whether to allow advance requests for MAiD. This would remove the critical safeguard of requiring consent at the time a person's life is ended through MAiD.
- A special committee of MPs and Senators has recommended expanding MAiD to those under 18 years of age.
